

Monica MacDonald

Monica MacDonald (born 5 May 1967) is an [Australian](#) former [ice dancer](#). She was a seven-time champion at the [Australian Figure Skating Championships](#).

With partner [Rodney Clarke](#), MacDonald won four consecutive national titles, beginning in 1985. The duo competed at the [1988 Winter Olympic Games](#), finishing in 20th place. They were the first Australian Ice Dance team to medal in an International event finishing in 3rd place in Olomouc. In 1989, she paired with [Duncan Smart](#), and the duo won the next three national titles. MacDonald is the mother of competitive single skaters [Chantelle Kerry](#) who competed in the Inaugural Youth Winter Olympic Games and [Brendan Kerry](#) who competed in the 2014 Winter Olympic Games in Sochi and of Lillian Yan.^{[1][2]} She currently coaches singles and ice dancing in Australia. MacDonald is also an ISU Technical Specialist.
