Foreign Synchronized Skater Permission Procedure 2022-2023

Overview

This Procedure is for obtaining official permission for non-Australian citizens to skate in Australian Synchronized Skating teams. Skaters who have been granted residency but not citizenship must obtain a clearance.

Skaters who have never competed for and/or never skated in the country of their citizenship MUST STILL OBTAIN A CLEARANCE. There are NO exceptions.

PROCEDURE

- 1 Teams shall notify their State Association of any team member who is not an Australian Citizen and submit a copy of the skater's passport and test documentation. (Teams shall also notify their State if they intend to seek international selection in 2022-2023.)
- 2 The State Association shall forward all the documentation, and confirmation of membership to ISA as soon **as the skater is accepted into the team**. (States shall also notify ISA if the team intends to seek international selection in 2022-2022.)
- 3 ISA shall then determine if the skater is the citizen of a foreign ISU member and of their test eligibility to skate in the team.
- 4 For skaters who are citizens of a foreign ISU member and have permission from ISA, ISA shall request permission for them to skate in and/or for Australia for the year 1st July 2022 to 30th June 2023.
- 5 For non-Australian skaters who are not citizens of a foreign ISU member and have permission from ISA, ISA shall endorse the permission in writing for them to skate in the requesting team.
- 6 A copy of relevant correspondence shall be given to the skater, team official and State Association.
- 7 ISA shall keep a separate register of all foreign skaters and copies of their documentation.

Decisions of Ice Skating Australia

All decisions of Ice Skating Australia relating to allowing foreign skaters in Australian teams shall be final.
